The Ontario Building & Construction Tradeswomen (OBCT) is currently recruiting unionized tradeswomen to participate in our film project.

Our project aims to create individual videos for each of the building trades. These videos will be used to provide a realistic representation of the skills needed for the job and what each trade does day-to-day.

The videos will be used by the OBCT to promote tradeswomen, to recruit young and second-career workers into the unionized trades through **Construction Training & Apprenticeship Ontario** (CTAO), and other promotional opportunities through the **Provincial Building & Construction Trades Council of Ontario** (PBCTCO).

We are looking for qualified Tradeswomen to represent their specific skilled trade on-site. All interested tradeswomen will be interviewed by Jennifer Mossop and provided an opportunity for a pre-interview in order to build rapport. The OBCT will work with your local union, company, and jobsite to ensure that the logistical transition of our film team on-site is smooth.
